The May BOW cause is the Human Library of the Fox Valley. The Human Library is a nonprofit that engages the public in conversations about equality, diversity, and human rights, with the goals of reducing tension and violence and increasing social cohesion. Organized completely by volunteers, human libraries are events modeled after traditional libraries where visitors check out a range of titles. The difference is that 'books' are people, and 'reading' is a conversation. The Human Library of the Fox Valley, an initiative of the recently incorporated not-for-profit Fox Valley Face-to-Face, was founded by FVFTF board members Jennifer DuBose, Cara Schuster, and Mary Swanson and is endorsed by the Human Library Organization based in Denmark. They partner with local volunteers including several UUSG folks from traditionally marginalized groups, human 'books,' to create safe, free opportunities for 'readers' to better understand those with whom they share their communities. UUSG is proud to partner with The Human Library to challenge prejudice, one book at a time.
