Today, Guest in the Pulpit: Thom Thomas - "Pulling Out of the Mud" After many years running training programs in the corporate world, Thom Thomas has decided to put his training and experience to work in a different arena, and is currently a Master's of Divinity student at Meadville Lombard Theological School. What does these shocking statistics mean for us, in light of our covenant to promote practical goodness in the world? Join us next Sunday for a discussion of mass incarceration with Alan Mills, the Executive Director of the Uptown People's Law Center in Chicago, where he has worked since 1979. UPLC represents tenants facing wrongful eviction, disabled people wrongfully denied social security benefits, and people in prison whose rights have been violated while they are in prison.

RAICES is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit agency that promotes justice by providing free and low-cost legal services to underserved immigrant children, families, and refugees in Texas. The ACLU Immigrants' Rights Project is dedicated to expanding and enforcing the civil liberties and civil rights of immigrants and to combating public and private discrimination against them. Using targeted impact litigation, advocacy, and public outreach, the ACLU protects the rights and liberties of immigrants.
