Navigating the Year Ahead: Board Statement on UUSG's COVID-19 Reopening Strategy. As UUSG looks ahead to the coming year, we're thrilled to begin our new journey with Rev. Scot Hull. This year's plenary speaker (Ware Lecturer) is Naomi Klein, Gloria Steinem Endowed Chair in Media, Culture and Feminist Studies at Rutgers University.

On June 28, in lieu of our own 10am Zoom service, UUSG will join General Assembly Sunday Morning Worship at 9am CST, which will be followed immediately by UUSG social hour.
