Swedish Days Results

This year's Swedish Days pizza booth brought together over 105 volunteers, who served 282 pizzas, collected \$243.25 for our youth's July Habitat for Humanity trip, and made \$2,654 for UUSG.

In addition, due to our "Buy Back the Pizza Booth" campaign, we sent \$2,200 to the Northern Illinois Food Bank.

FY2013-2014 Financial Summary

Income

We budgeted for an income of \$348,200 with a projected deficit of \$19,833 (for a total of \$368,033). We received actual income of \$370,964, which is \$22,764 over the budgeted amount.

Even after we account for the projected deficit, our income was still \$2,931 over the budgeted amount.

Details: We continued to receive pledges after the budget was approved, so the projected pledge income in the budget was lower than our actual pledges. Pledge income came in at 109% of the budgeted amount.

Expenses

We budgeted for expenses of \$368,033 and spent \$360,357, which is \$7,676 under the budgeted amount.

Details: Although our "Place" expenses were higher than expected, expenses for musicians, childcare, the Interweave Group, the WOW Team, and worship were lower than expected.

Surplus

Total actual income	\$370,964
Total actual expenses	<u>\$360,357</u>
Surplus	\$ 10,607

The surplus of \$10,607 has been moved from our checking account into the Elsa Ollsson Capital Endowment Fund until the Board decides on further action.

We also collected \$27,548.94 in "Beyond Our Walls" and loose plate collections going to social justice causes.

Caring for Those "Beyond Our Walls"

Your generous "Beyond Our Walls" contributions in July sent \$926 to Mutual Ground Shelter in Aurora.

Mutual Ground's mission is to provide a safety net of services for victims of domestic abuse, including emotional abuse and sexual assault. Although only women and children can stay at the shelter, Mutual Ground helps 1,500 men, women, and children each year.

"Change for a Change"

Many thanks to everyone who dropped coins (or bills) in the "Change for a Change" Jar in the Sanctuary between July 2013 and June 2014. Because of your generosity, we were able to send \$311.19 to the Jane Adeny Memorial School (JAMS) in rural western Kenya.

This high school was built several years ago to educate girls. The student body has grown quickly from 12 to almost 60. The school needs many things, including beds, books, and science lab equipment, as well as money to cover tuition for orphans and daughters of poor farm families.

The jar is ready to fill again, this time to support Bridge Communities.


