Deity, a theistic cry to the Mystery, a Christian or Jewish appeal to G-d, a Buddhist wish that all may find peace, a humanist expression of caring, an intentional sending of Light or Love or Energy, almost everyone has a way of turning within to focus feelings of concern, hopes for healing, expressions of love and compassion, and then turning outward again to send those thoughts into the universe. We all have ways of relating to the Mystery; unfortunately, we're not always comfortable exploring those ways with others. But the spiritual path is often made smoother by our companions on the way. And so we are forming groups of companions.

The groups' covenant is pretty simple: We promise each other a place of safety, acceptance, gentle listening, confidentiality, and respect. Our individual spiritual paths are often quite idiosyncratic, and it takes deep trust to share those paths and the prayers that emerge from them. These are not groups for cynics or skeptics. These are for UUs who pray, and want to share prayers of joy and gratitude, comfort and concern, with others.

Enough people responded to the invitation to help start UUSG Prayer Circle gatherings that we're going ahead with

three monthly opportunities to gather with other UUSG folk, talk about prayer, and, more importantly, pray together, exploring different ways of praying in a Unitarian Universalist context. The groups will meet on the Second Sunday at 7 PM, the Second Monday at 7 PM, and the Fourth Tuesday at 1 in the afternoon. In September, that will be September 11, September 12, and September 27.

If you'd like to come and experience what we're doing and you're OK with those covenantal promises, we'd love to have you join us. Please let me know which of the three groups you'd like to attend.



UUSG Says 'No' to Fossil Fuel Investments

Effective this month, UUSG will no longer invest in any companies involved in the production or sale of fossil fuels which contribute to global warming. The move is an advancement in the church's socially responsible investing (SRI) strategy.

"The sustainable strategy aligns our church's investment criteria with the green values UUSG embraces," Robert Swanson, Treasurer of UUSG stated. "We would like our position to motivate others to evaluate their fossil fuel investments, and initiate more widespread change to green energy."

UUSG has been committed to SRI for about 10 years. The new initiative tightens UUSG's SRI screening to also exclude companies involved in the fossil fuels industry — gasoline, coal, natural gas, etc. An SRI approach considers both financial return and social responsibility to bring about positive change. Environmental care, consumer protection, human rights and diversity are encouraged, while alcohol, tobacco, gambling, weapons and other harmful products are avoided.


We Want You!

Ongoing Teacher Recruitment


We are forming teacher teams for next year's LRE classes. Thank you to all who have signed up already!
