As we begin to think of our history with the 175th anniversary of UUSG

coming up, I have been reflecting on what I have seen as being a member of this church since 1978. When I started attending, Rev. Lindsay had just arrived, and was ordained in our church. Small world—Max Gabler, minister of the Madison, WI, church officiated. I was a member of his church for 2 years and he married my husband Jim and I! The congregation was small, about 100, with volunteers cleaning and Lindsay doing most of the secretarial, maintenance, ministering, and whatever else came up. We did not have other paid staff. People who came to hear her, stayed, and the church grew.

Dick Malm, an architect in the congregation designed the new addition, we all pitched in with carpentry, electrical, plumbing and painting. The Common Room used to end about where you see a beam across the ceiling—very small. Pioneer House was separate. The basement of the new addition was unfinished, but slowly completed in the next few years. Everyone who worked on the addition signed the floor of the Common Room before the carpet was laid. It was a time when everyone knew everyone, and was pretty dynamic, but generated burn out too. We had a small Board, no Council. Many Board presidents have come and gone. I think Jane Willard was the first woman.

In the years since, we have grown, becoming a teaching congregation with interns who stayed for a year, and Lindsay acting as mentor. We acquired Adam Robersmith as an assistant minister, a choir that sang every month (not in summer), a junior choir that sang about every two months. Edith was our organist. Yes, we had an electric organ! When she died, we switched to piano -- a brand new one! In the 2000s, the Sanctuary underwent a big refurbishing with the whole floor being reconstructed. We have had major studies about expanding, tearing down Pioneer House and building a large sanctuary, two stories on the addition, etc. Money and Geneva regulations have slowed the enthusiasm. However, now I look around and we are such a dynamic, young, growing church with a wonderful music program, and Rev. Scott as our new Assistant Minister. I delight in the youth and think of all the wonderful people I have met and gotten to know over the years, many of them now gone. They would be proud of UUSG as I am, a welcoming, warm place of friendship and common purpose.

November Music at UUSG



Technical Difficulties...


We have had/are having/will alas continue to have technical difficulties here at the office.


